



‘ALEXANDRA’S AIRPLANE SCARF’: Crocheted Color-Tipped Version
Instructions for adding a contrasting crocheted edge to your
Churchmouse Classics ‘Alexandra’s Airplane Scarf’ in Isager Silk Mohair.

Yarn for edging: 1 skein Isager *Silk Mohair* (231 yds/212m each) in a contrasting color.
Or approx. 20 yds/18m of an equivalent lace-weight mohair yarn in a contrasting color.

Needles
& Notions: US E/4 (3.5mm) crochet hook, or size to obtain correct tension on edging.

Glossary: Ch = chain; RS = right side; SC = single crochet; Sl St = slip stitch.

Please refer to the original pattern for complete instructions.
Only changes are covered in this adaptation. Read original instructions thoroughly.

Scarf: Complete scarf as directed in original pattern up to Blocking.

Edging: *With RS facing, using crochet hook, join contrasting color yarn with Sl St to cast-on end of scarf near a side fold.

Round 1: Ch 1, SC in every cast-on st to end of round controlling tension so that edge doesn’t ruffle or pull in. Join to beginning of round with Sl St. *Note: You should have the same number of sc as your initial cast-on count.*

Round 2: Ch 1, SC in each sc to end of round. Join to beginning of round with Sl St. Cut yarn and fasten off.*

Repeat between * * for bound-off end of scarf.

Finishing: Block and finish piece according to pattern instructions. If adding color-tipping to an already blocked scarf, gently steam press ends with a press cloth. Allow to dry thoroughly.
