



**‘BASIC CHRISTMAS STOCKINGS’: Striped in Blue Sky Fibers Woolstok Bundles
Knitter’s Notes for striping your Churchmouse Classics
‘Basic Christmas Stockings’ using Blue Sky Fibers Woolstok Bundles.**

*There are many ways to use Blue Sky Fibers Woolstok Bundles for your stocking:
wide or narrow stripes, repeating or random, maybe even a little colorwork if you’re feeling fancy!*

Yarn: 1 (2, 2) Blue Sky Fibers Woolstok Bundle(s) (3 mini-skeins each of 7 colors; 12 yds/10m per mini-skein). For our Wee Stocking, we used colorway Holiday Cheer.
Cuff: 3 (6, 9) mini-skeins. We used Wild Thyme.
Leg: 6 (10, 14) mini-skeins. We used Colors A = Gravel Road, B = Red Rock, C = Highland Fleece, and D = Earth Ivy.
Heel & Toe: 2 (2, 3) mini-skeins each. We used Cranberry Compote for the heel and Cast Iron for the toe.
Foot: 4 (7, 9) mini-skeins. We used the same colors as the leg.
Note: See original pattern for approx. yds/m required for each section.

*Please refer to the original pattern for complete instructions.
Only project specific details are covered in these notes.*

Our sample notes: For our Wee Stocking, we used a single color for the cuff and worked until it ran out.
Note: You’ll have enough mini-skeins for a single color cuff on a Medium Stocking, but not for a Jolly Big. Try working the outer portion of the cuff in one color and the inner in another.

We worked 12-round stripes (using a single mini-skein per stripe) for the leg and foot in the following order:

A, B, C, D, B, A, D, C, A (placing heel in the middle of this stripe), C, B, D.

Note: We worked a longer leg (approx. 17½"/44.5cm); foot measures approx. 6"/15.5cm).

We worked the toe in a single color, using just over 1 mini-skein.

We worked the heel and I-cord hanger in a single color, using just over 1 mini-skein.

Jogless stripes: To create jogless stripes (3 rounds or more):

On final round before color change: Work to 1 st before marker; holding current and new color together K1. Drop old color and continue working with new color only.

First round of new color: Knit to 1 st before marker. You should have a loop of old and new color on your left needle. Treating them as 2 separate sts, SSK. *Notes: This will bring the old color over the new one. Snug up yarn tails behind your work to tighten sts.*

Next round: Slip first st purlwise, knit to end of round.

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
